The Centre for Multicultural Youth is hosting a forum looking at the changing face of settlement for young refugees in Victoria.

Migration and settlement patterns of young people are changing. Until recently, most young people came to Australia with family members and after spending time in refugee camps. Today, young people may be unaccompanied minors and may have arrived by boat and spent time in immigration detention. Young people are also settling in local government areas that have not traditionally seen such settlement.
