Multicultural Leaders in Sustainability (MLS) is a training program for young people from migrant and refugee backgrounds. Through the program, you will gain skills and knowledge to help educate communities about environmental sustainability issues. During the training you will be supported to develop and implement a sustainability project in your local community.

Who can apply?

All people aged 18-25, from migrant and refugee backgrounds can apply for MLS. MLS will recruit and train a total of 12-16 Environmental Ambassadors from a range of backgrounds in Melbourne.

When does it happen?

The training will begin in February 2007. Between February and July 2007 Environmental Ambassadors will complete 12 modules of training. Environmental Ambassadors need to commit to an equivalent of 3 hours per week to the environmental leadership training.

What will I get out of it?

- Recognised training accreditation.
- Meet new people with a passion for environment.
- Gain skills, confidence, experience and knowledge in a range of areas to help you find exciting work and education pathways.
- Work with leading environmental, cultural and education professionals.
- Contribute to your community by helping people learn about and benefit from environmental sustainability.
- Potential for further training and education opportunities after MLS.

How much does it cost?

The training is FREE. The costs of the training and project work are funded through MLS project partners and the State Government. Your travel costs incurred will be reimbursed.
