Training for volunteer tutors

Strategies for EAL maths **NEW**

Tuesday February 20th, 10am-12 OR 6pm-8pm

For EAL students, learning maths may be complicated by cultural differences in how it is taught and by the English components within maths problems. However, maths is not as language dependent as other areas of the curriculum, so there is potential for it to be a positive experience for EAL students. In this module you will explore strategies that support the learning of mathematics for EAL students. 2 hours.

Supporting positive behaviour **NEW**

Monday June 18th 10am-12 OR 6pm-8pm

This module will increase your understanding of reasons for different behaviours. You will explore strategies and skills to re-engage students in their learning and practice different approaches to encourage positive behaviour. 2 hours.

Culturally responsive tutoring

**Wednesday July 25th, 10am-12 OR
Monday October 8th, 6pm-8pm**

What does it mean to be culturally responsive? In this module you will have an opportunity to explore your own cultural perspectives and consider how this impacts on your tutoring. We look at the skills you need to be culturally responsive and apply these to tutor situations.

Creating a safe and supportive environment

**Wednesday March 14th, 6pm-8pm OR
Thursday November 15th, 10am-12**

This module explores techniques tutors can use to create a positive learning environment. It also looks at the professional boundaries and child safety requirements of tutoring.

Tutoring strategies for EAL students

Wednesday May 2nd, 10am-12 OR 6pm-8pm

The four skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing are the foundation of literacy. This session introduces practical and fun activities to support EAL students to practice these.

Training for coordinators

Creating a child safe OSHLSP

**Tuesday 20st March, 10-3pm
OR Thursday 9th August 10am-3pm**

In response to the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse Victoria has introduced compulsory minimum standards of child safety for organisations that supply services for children. This module explores how OSHLSP can be aware of the risks and how to reduce them. Participants will learn about child safety, the standards and how to apply them to their program.

Evaluating your program helps keep it relevant and improves quality. This module will explore the evaluation process, methods used to establish a baseline and the use of student friendly techniques for gathering data.
