The project was inspired by this year's theme for Commonwealth Day: 'a peace building Commonwealth'.

Commonwealth Day unites 2.4 billion people across the world who live in one of the many countries within the Commonwealth of Nations.

If each of us makes a contribution, then we can build peace by piece.
