Education training is pleased to offer FREE training sessions for Homework Clubs (OSHLSPs) at our Carlton venue in 2017. Training for volunteer tutors

Culturally responsive tutoring **Wednesday March 8th** **1-3pm OR 5.30-7.30pm**

What does it mean to be culturally responsive? In this module you will have an opportunity to explore your own cultural perspectives and consider how this impacts on your tutoring. We look at the skills you need to be culturally responsive and apply these to tutor situations.

Creating a safe and supportive environment in your OSHLSP **Thursday May 25th** **10am- 12md OR 4-6pm**

This module explores techniques tutors can use to create a positive learning environment. It also looks at the professional boundaries and child safety requirements of tutoring.

Tutoring strategies for EAL students **Tuesday August 29th** **10am-12md OR 4-6pm**

The four skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing are the foundation of literacy. This session introduces practical and fun activities to support EAL students to practice these.

Training for coordinators

Engaging with families in your OSHLSP **Tuesday February 28th** **10am- 1pm**

Many homework clubs would like to communicate more effectively with families of students from refugee and migrant backgrounds. Come to this workshop to share ideas and explore ways to engage and consult.

Creating a child safe OSHLSP **Thursday May 11th** **10am- 3pm**

In response to the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse Victoria has introduced compulsory minimum standards of child safety for organisations that supply services for children. This module explores how OSHLSP can be aware of the risks and how to reduce them. Participants will learn about child safety, the standards and how to apply them to their program.

Listening to young people **Wednesday August 9th** **10am- 1pm**

It's important to facilitate opportunities for children and young people to participate in the planning, review and evaluation of services. This module will provide lots of practical tips to help you establish participatory practice in your OSHLSP.

Evaluating your OSHLSP **Monday November 13th** **5- 7pm**

Evaluating your program helps keep it relevant and improves quality. This module will explore the evaluation process, methods used to establish a baseline and the use of student friendly techniques for gathering data.
