



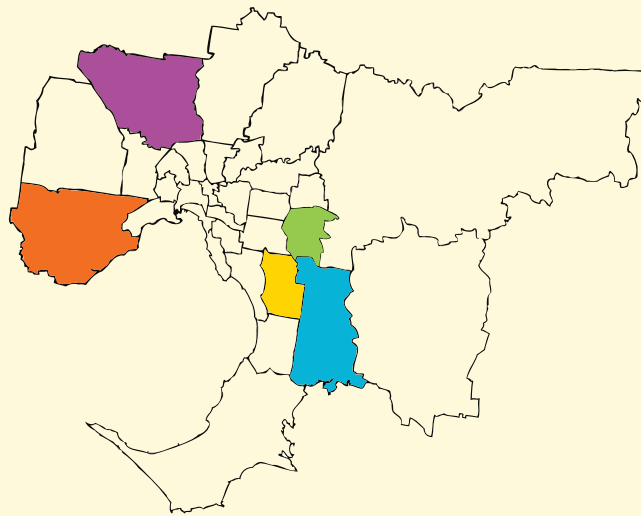

- Maroondah (85)

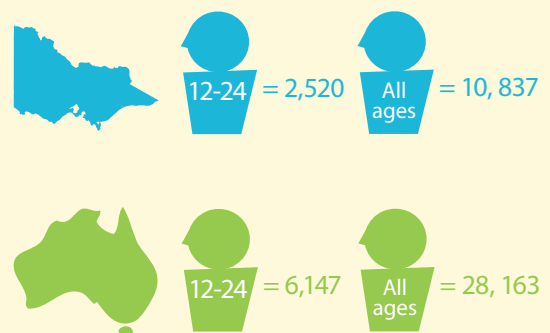


1 out of 3 Humanitarian Youth Arrivals settled in Victoria.

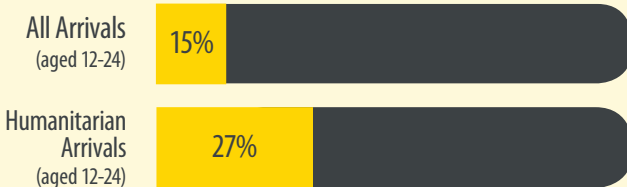
% of 12-24 year old BVE holders who live in Victoria



BVE holders by age group, March 2016

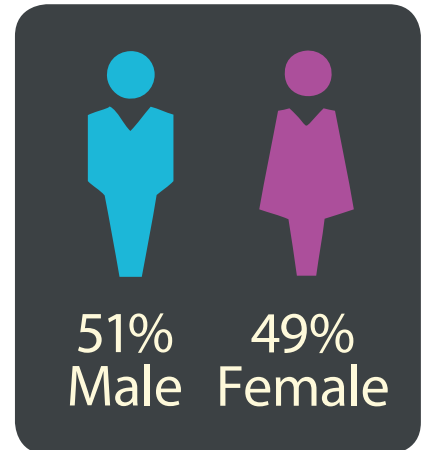
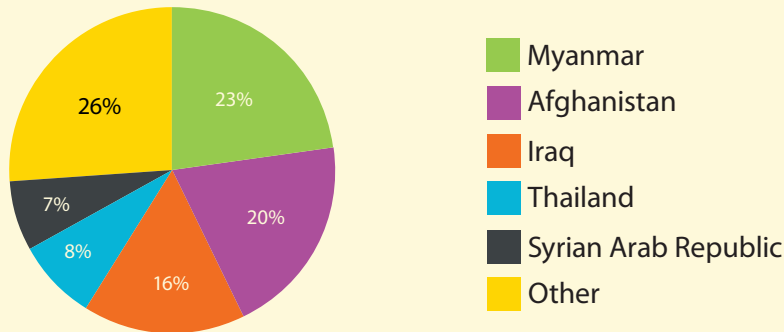


Humanitarian youth by age group, 2015/16

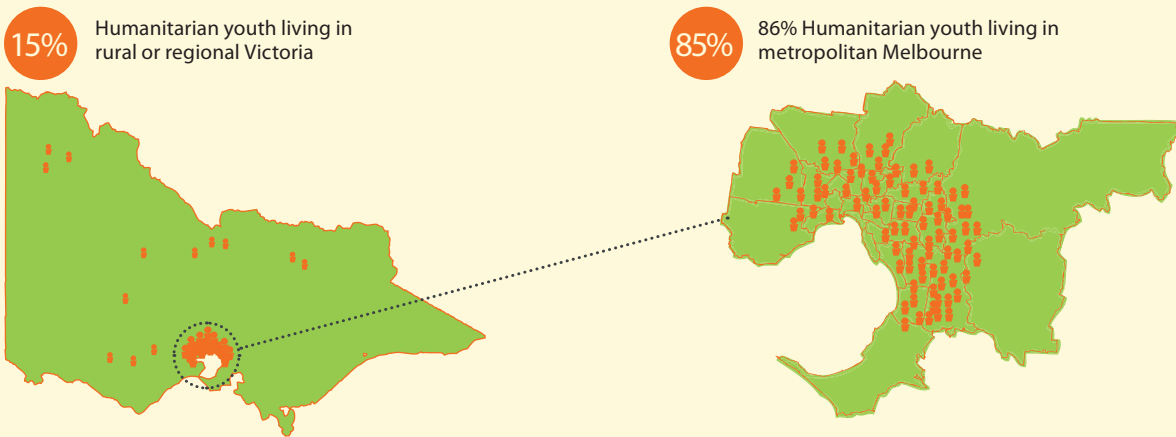

Humanitarian youth by country of birth (Top 5)

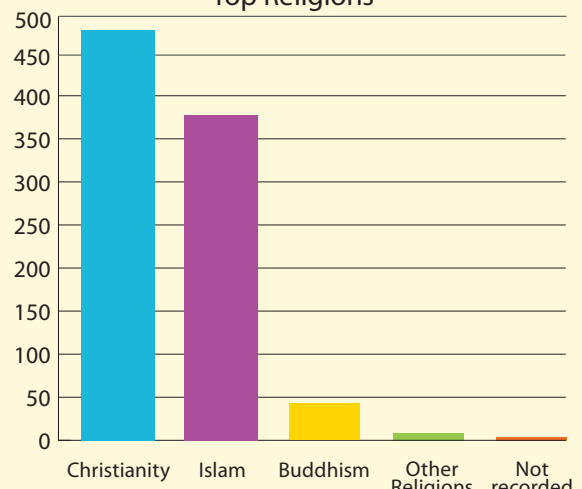


Settlement by Victorian local government areas
